


# **CP935W Quick Start**




#### **☆** TIP

One power adapter (5V/0.6A) is for W70B base station, the other one (12V/1.25A) is for CP935W.

# **Charge CP935W**






# **☆** TIP

- $\bullet$  Use Yealink-supplied power adapter (12 V/1.25 A). A third-party power adapter may damage the wireless conference phone.
- Check the charging status in the upper-left corner of the LCD screen.

#### **Hardware Introduction**







N o	Item	Description			
1	Mute Key	<ul><li>Toggle mute feature.</li><li>Indicate phone and call status.</li></ul>			
2	Speaker	Provide speakerphone audio output.			
3	LCD Screen	Show information about calls, messages, Bluetooth, time, date and other relevant data.			
4	Volume Key(+)	Increase the volume of the speaker, ringer, or media.			
5	Volume Key(-)	Decrease the volume of the speaker, ringer, or media.			
6	Home Button	Long press to power on/off or return to the home page with one-touch.			
7	Six Internal Microphon es	Provide 20-feet (6 meters) and 360-degree sound pickup.			
8	Contact Charging Port	Put the port to the charging cradle to charge.			
9	Security Slot	Allow you to connect a universal security cable to your phone so you can lock down your phone. The phone will not be removed after locked.			
1 0	USB Type- C Port	Allow you to connect a PC and turn your phone into an external speaker and microphone for your PC.			

### Power On/Off

**Power on**: Press the home key for 3 seconds or charge the CP935W.

**Power off**: Press the home key for 10 seconds then tap OK or tap **More** > **Basic** > **Power Off** > **OK** on the LCD screen of the CP935W.



### **Mute Touch Key LED Indicators**

LED Status	Description			
Solid red	<ul><li>The phone is initializing.</li><li>The phone is muted.</li></ul>			
Flashing red	The phone is ringing.			
Solid green	<ul><li>The phone is placing a call.</li><li>There is an active call on the phone.</li><li>The call is placed on hold or is held.</li></ul>			
Flashing orange	The phone prompts low battery or is charging.			
Off	<ul><li>The phone is powered off.</li><li>The phone is idle.</li></ul>			

#### Idle Screen and Icons Introduction

The user screens and icon indicators can help you navigate and understand the important information on the phone's status.

The idle screen is made up of the signal strength, battery status, status bar, handset name, and soft keys. The time & date is displayed in the middle of the screen.

Statu s Bar	Displays the feature status icons. The status icons are displayed when features are activated.

Soft Keys	The soft key labels on the screen directly above the soft keys show the functions available at that particular moment.
